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



# What We Do

Club 21 provides the educational tools and resources that enable individuals with Down syndrome to be fully included. From first diagnosis onward, Club 21 empowers families to identify the needs of their child with Down syndrome and teaches them how to navigate the medical, educational and regional center systems to maximize their child's potential. For that to be a reality, family support, school support, direct educational training and community building are essential. All of our programs and services fall into these four categories. Club 21's ultimate vision is that the individuals with Down syndrome who follow our educational pathway will have opportunities for lifelong learning, independence/interdependence, communities of belonging, meaningful employment, and live self-determined and fulfilling lives. By providing training and resources at every step along this pathway, Club 21 enables families to advocate for and maximize the opportunities and services that are available to their child.






### The West Family

"Our son is a young adult with complex communication needs. When Club 21 gave him the opportunity to participate in a new pilot program, Meaningful Life Learning Circles for transitional age young adults, we jumped at the chance. This program was held on Zoom and was the perfect platform for our son. He was able to focus on the screen and what the lessons were about and felt comfortable without the normal distractions of an in person large group class setting. He would attend the online sessions with his personal assistant and showed all of us how capable he was of communicating and expressing his opinions and understanding, using his iPad or AAC communication device.

This program was a huge success for him and he was able to learn, listen and communicate with his peers. Having this community support opens a door for him to flourish and grow."



### The Kulzer-Reyes Family: Why We Drive

Our family found Club 21 Learning and Resource Center eleven years ago after our daughter unexpectedly joined our family with a chromosomal enhancement. We attended our first Second Saturday in early 2013; Amelia was six months old. We immediately felt at home, and we have committed to be present despite the distance for our family. We have driven over 200 miles, 100 miles each way, each second Saturday, except during the shutdown for eleven years. Our teen sibling loves to volunteer at SibShops and carrying things around for the Club 21 team. Our daughter loves being at Club 21 and asks to go all month long. And our youngest loves the energy and love we all get from being there together. Club 21 is our community, and we are so grateful to have found a place where we all belong.







### Eileen Weist, Educator

I can do this!! I was introduced to Club 21 through one of my student's parents. She offered to send me to Club 21's Educational Partnership program. After 16 years of teaching,

I still had no experience teaching students with Down syndrome. I was apprehensive and lost in all areas. After my first day with the Educational Partnership program, I left with so much more knowledge and information and IDEAS. I had contacts, I had people to ask questions about what to do in addition to the trainings. Needless to say, I was hooked, I attended almost all of the trainings, and my learning curve was straight up. I still go back to my notes and outlines for answers to questions. My student has made HUGE growth. When she read her first short story, I thought I was going to cry. She has changed my teaching life. She has taught me that all students are capable of learning. We just need to change our delivery and expectations of how to measure understanding.

I believe in the knowledge base I received from Club 21 and their willingness to come alongside educators as well as parents. They are a support, a cheerleader and a wealth of information. Since my first day of training, I have chosen to support Club 21, not only financially, but also by sharing what I learned. I truly encourage all educators to attend their Educational Partnership program, Don't get stuck in the mindset "I can't", get up and learn HOW! Then, together, both you and the student will learn and attain great things.



### **Pedersen Family**

We attended our 1st First Steps gathering when Ace was just 4 months old. We were greeted with so much warmth and love from the moment we entered Nancy's backyard. It was truly an incredible feeling to not only be accepted but also celebrated for the differences that some people fear and the majority of people don't fully understand. For almost 2 years, we have depended on this community. It's been our safe space. We have formed beautiful trusting relationships and are looking forward to watching these babies grow up together.

We've really enjoyed the programs and services so far in our young journey at Club 21, and we're so proud to be part of this community. The Stepping Up program has already provided us with a wealth of knowledge as we gear up for the IEP process and our little Ace's educational future. We depend on and appreciate the open forum during these sessions. Hearing from other parents in similar situations and sharing resources has made this sometimes lonely experience feel enjoyable and exciting! We don't know what we would do without this fearless support system, our club 21 family.

**80** teams with over **1500** family members, friends and supporters participated in our annual Together is Better Walk & Celebration and raised **\$238,000** to support Club 21 programs






