What is Club 21's Educational Partnership Program?

This program reinforces the partnership between educators, schools and families. Through this collaborative process, successful inclusion happens.

The program has 2 components:

- 4 Cohorts: Each participant will be placed with a cohort of their peers (Preschool, K-1st, 2nd-5th, and Transition 101 for ages 13-16)
- Parent training
Parents receive the education and tools needed to support their child's educational program at 4 evening workshops throughout the school year
- Educator training
Equips educators to best serve students with Down syndrome in their classrooms with up-to-date research, tools, resources and strategies through an online course. A stipend will be given to each educator on completion of each module. Many of the topics are applicable to all students, with or without IEPs.

What is the curriculum Content?

- Learning profile of a child with Down syndrome along with best practices and teaching strategies
- Tools and resources for your classroom/school
- Technology to support the classroom
- Classroom differentiation and modifications
- Behavior support and strategies
- Equipping para-educators
- Peer and social support

What is the cost?

The cost of the program is \$300 which includes all 4 parent and teacher trainings. One educator per enrolled family is included in this cost. Cost for an additional educator is \$100. A stipend will be given to each educator on completion of each module of the online course.

NEW THIS YEAR Transition 101

Every child with an IEP must have a Transition IEP by the age of 16 years old. This can be an overwhelming process, but it doesn't need to be if you have preparation and tools. Richard Rosenberg will lead you through:

- What is a transition plan and when do I need to get started?
- What career preparation and opportunities are available during High School?
- The importance of volunteer work
- What are my expectations for High School, Community College, and Beyond
- Every parent and educator will have access to a resource facilitator to guide them throughout the year.
