What We Do

From first diagnosis onward, Club 21 empowers families to identify the needs of their child with Down syndrome and teaches them how to navigate the terrain of the medical, educational, and Regional Center systems to maximize their child's potential. For that to be a reality, family support, school support, direct educational training, and community building are essential. All of our programs and services fall into these 4 categories. Club 21 believes education has the power to change lives, communities and the world. Through its educational pathway, Club 21 is changing the narrative of Down syndrome and opening doors so that individuals with Down syndrome can be fully included and live, healthy, self-determined and fulfilling lives.





Club 21 **2020 Year In Review**

77 toddlers, children, teens and young adults with Down syndrome and their parents stayed connected virtually in online educational programs - Stepping Up, Every Child a Reader (ECAR), Club FUN, The CREW and **Club Connections.**

"Our son is reading! Like really reading! Like pointing to words in a sentence and reading (no pictures or cues). The first time he did it, he was surprised, screamed with excitement and yelled, "Whaaat! Yeah, baby! Let's do this!" " (Parent)

The new

Self Determination Program in California allows families to choose the services they need/want for their child. Club 21 piloted a new Self-Determination Program Learning Circle with 16 families to learn how to access this program.

"Kelly prepared me to move forward with the Self Determination Plan, I could not have done this without her." (Parent)

We modified our **Education** Partnership program so that parents and educators could meet online and access invaluable tools and information virtually. Over the past 7 years, 511 parents and teachers from 70 school districts have participated in this program.

team captains virtually advocated for Down syndrome awareness and raised \$144,000 from 1,211 supporters for Club 21 programs and services at our 13th annual **Together is Better Walk 2020: Closing Ceremony**



240 volunteers

did special projects and mailings, read aloud story recordings for students, participated in virtual Second Saturday classes, provided virtual music and photography classes and assembled IEP notebooks. 5 During the pandemic Club 21 continued to offer resources and support to **new and expectant parents.** Although our First Steps team was not able to meet in person, we were able to connect with families via phone and zoom providing one on one support, connections with other families and an online Talk Tools feeding class. **First Call/First Steps** early intervention programs were active reaching out to new parents via personal phone calls, resources and gift baskets.



134 moms and dads stayed connected in community groups -Moms Meet Up, D.A.D.S., Bienvenidos virtual gatherings.

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


 85 families and educators attended our first all virtual

Created a **10 week** virtual **IEP Workshop** facilitated by experts in the field for parents to become their child's best advocate.


