# <u>NEW THIS YEAR - Partnership with Erik Carter</u> and his 10 Dimensions of Belonging:

School should be a place of belonging for "every" student. Belonging is easy to affirm but much harder to define. Schools that are committed to the concept of belonging must be intentional and have a strong understanding of the practices and postures that contribute to this goal. When true inclusion happens, schools become a place of belonging for all students. This program will give you specific strategies so that every student in your classroom will know they are valued and belong.



# What is Club 21's Educational Partnership Program?

This program reinforces the partnership between educators, schools and families. Through this collaborative process opportunities for belonging are increased.

#### The program has 2 components:

• Parent training

Parents receive the education and tools needed to support their child's educational program at 6 VIRTUAL evening workshops throughout the school year.

• Educator training

Equips educators to best serve students with Down syndrome in their classrooms with up-to-date research, tools, resources and strategies in 4 all-day workshops (including Tools for the Journey Conference). Many of the topics are applicable to all students, with or without special needs.

• Cohorts - Each participant will be placed with a cohort of their peers (Preschool, K-1st, 2nd-5th, and Middle/High school)

## What is the curriculum Content?

- Learning profile of a child with Down syndrome along with best practices and teaching strategies
- 10 Dimensions of Belonging
- Classroom differentiation and modifications
- Behavior support and strategies
- Peer and social support

### What is the cost?

- \$300 (includes one teacher registration)
- \$50 for each additional educator per training session

\*Club 21 will cover the substitute fee for one educator per family.
