Biggs, Ph.D. is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Special Education at Vanderbilt University and is affiliated with the Vanderbilt Kennedy Center, which is an interdisciplinary research, service, and training center focused on improving the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. As a researcher, Biggs focuses on identifying ways to promote strong social, communication, language, and literacy outcomes for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities who are nonspeaking

or who have limited speech, with a specific interest in augmentative and alternative communication (AAC), inclusive education, family-school partnerships, and friendships among students with and without disabilities
